## Company History

### 1940s

**1949 February**  
Toyo Carrier Manufacturing Co., Ltd. the root of TCM brand, was initially founded by Genji-ritsu entrepreneur, Mu, N, Nawa for manufacturing and marketing of forklift trucks.

**1949 March**  
The first Japan-made forklift truck was manufactured in the Sekime factory.




### 1950s

**1950 February**  
As a pioneer of manufacturing forklift trucks, TCM exported the first forklift truck to overseas, [Taiwan, F.O.C.]

**1952**  
TCM developed the full free three-stage mast for high-lift operation.

**1954 September**  
Ryugaiki factory was established by taking over the existing facilities of Tojin Industry Co., Ltd.

**1956-1985**  
A technical cooperation agreement was signed with Clark Equipment Co., Ltd., U.S.A. TCM developed Tor-Co-Matic, (Torque converter and power shift transmission)



### 1960s

**1961 April**  
Osaka factory (Yodogawa factory) was established by taking over from Tojin Industry Co., Ltd.

**1963 April**  
TCM established the first foreign distributor in Australia, Westco Australia Pty., Ltd.

**1968-1970**  
Shiga factory was established by taking over from Osaka factory for the better quality production management under the dramatic expansion of the market needs.





### 1970s

**1970 October**  
Shiga factory was put into the full-scale operation.

**1976 July**  
TCM America (MBR) Inc. was established as a joint venture distributor in the U.S.A. with Matsui & Co., and its subsidiaries in the U.S.A.

**1979**  
TCM developed the two-cylinder mast for wider view operation.



### 1980s

**1983 November**  
TCM obtained a brilliantly big order of 1,000 units of forklift trucks from the Pentagon, U.S.A.

**1988 September**  
The regional forklift manufacturer, TCM Manufacturing, USA, Inc., (TMU) was established in South Carolina, U.S.A. as a part of the TCM globalization program.



### 1990s

**1990 May**  
TCM Europe S.A. (TEU) was founded in Brussels, Belgium, as a manufacturing and marketing stronghold in Europe.

**1991 January**  
Anhui Andong Foundry Co., Ltd. (AADF) was established as a joint venture between Japan and the People's Republic of China (here after PRC) for producing forklifts.

**1994 December**  
Anhui TCM Forklift Co., Ltd. (ATFC) was established as a joint venture of the Chinese national forklift company to produce and distribute its products in the P.R.C.

**1999 July**  
The company name has been changed to TCM Corporation.

### 2000s

**2001 July**  
TCM Asia Distribution Co., Ltd. (TAD) was established as a regional distributor in South Asia.

**2003 October**  
Shanghai TCM Forklift Trading Co., Ltd. (STFC) was established for the purpose of marketing the TCM products in the P.R.C.


**2005 June**  
TCM USA Holdings Inc. (TUH), fully owned by TCM, was established in Swedesboro, NJ, U.S.A. in order to control and consolidate the forklift manufacturing company, TMU and the marketing company, TDU.

**2006 March**  
TCM held the large scale TCM World Conference 2006 in Bangkok, Thailand, with more than 200 participants gathered from all over the world.

**2007**  
TCM and TLH successfully took over the business of CIM Industrial Machinery, Inc., and newly founded TCM Forklift Trucks, Inc. (TFTL).

**2008**  
TCM General Machinery Co., Ltd. (TCMAC) was established for the new forklift operation in the P.R.C.

**2009**  
Three U.S. affiliates merged to form TCM America, Inc. (TCMA)
